"Come expectantly seeking Jesus. Follow Him boldly. Go witness intentionally."



"When I was little, my grandfather used to make me stand in a closet for five minutes without moving. He said it was elevator practice." These are the words of the comedian Stephen Wright. I know this sounds a little weird, but Stephen Wright's grandfather may have been on to something. 99% of the time people spend in elevators is spent looking at three things: the floor, the ceiling, or the buttons on the wall. This is a poor choice if you are in the job market or have something you need to promote about your company or yourself.

In most communities 40 to 60 percent of people have no church relationship. That means most of your neighbors don't know where to turn when crisis hits. That means that most of the people gathered around the softball game or baseball game don't have a church. When we get our hair cut, or go out to eat, or attend a band concert there are people all around us who need to hear our elevator speech. It is very likely that the nurse who helps you, or the person who checks you out at the grocery store, or the wait person who serves you lunch do not have a church. And if you know that the Holy Spirit is working in every moment, you will also know that God has probably placed those people next to you for exactly that purpose.

Bishop Robert Schnase wrote: "Hospitality means we pray, plan, prepare, and work toward the purpose of helping others receive what we have received in Christ. Hospitality is more than common politeness to newcomers, name tags for greeters, or a few visitor parking places... Hospitality is a quality of spiritual initiative, the practice of an active and genuine love, a graciousness unaffected by self-interest...

Our church council has approved the formation of a Hospitality Committee. We need people who are loving, kind, and have a ready elevator speech for our guests and visitors. In the church AND outside of it. Over the top, crazy generous, radical hospitality. Is it you? Will you pray, plan, and prepare?



Affiliate Membership As before, an Affiliate member remains a member of another United Methodist Church but wishes to be involved in another particular UMC Church (Discipline, Para 227)

Associate Membership As before, an Affiliate member remains a member of another Christian denomination may become a member of a local United Methodist Church (Discipline, Para 227).

All three memberships are valid throughout the whole United Methodist denomination.

BELLS ARE RINGING!!!




This month, I want to introduce to you our most recognizable ringer as he is the only male ringer at the moment, Bill McPherson!! Bill " No Fear" McPherson
