It was right after Thanksgiving when a man named John Burley started crying out from his hospital bed that his precious pet dog named Boomer was in the pound.

"Boomer is in the pound!" "Boomer is in the pound!" John was on the phone to a nurse name Jennifer Smith. Jennifer had gotten to know John as

he stayed at the Grand Rehabilitation Center in Rome, New York. John was 60 years old and still had his own apartment, but he was trying to recover from pneumonia and other lung issues. John had family, but they were all in Arkansas. There in New York he was alone.

John asked Jennifer for help. She said, "I will take care of Boomer until you are able to go back home." Jennifer called the Rome animal shelter and sure enough, they had Boomer. Jennifer rescued Boomer and carried him home. Every day when she comes to work, she brings Boomer too. John tours the facility in his wheelchair, with Boomer in his lap. And the entire place is better for it. Healing happened faster this Christmas because one person saw the opportunity to make a difference.

In another town – Towson, Maryland – there was another man going through a hard time, struggling with depression, and not feeling a lot of hope. When one of his neighbors heard about it, he decided to do something. It was a huge thing. He ran a string of Christmas lights from his house, over the road, to his neighbor's house. When two other neighbors saw it, they decided to do it too. Then another neighbor got involved. The idea kept spreading all the way through Dunkirk Street. The entire street had Christmas lights cascading over the road. Home Depot ran out of Christmas lights. Another neighbor took wire and shaped it into letters that read, "Love lives here." They ran lights over that too. Every single neighbor. They even added a big mailbox at the end of the road to hold "letter to the north pole" so all the children can put their letter to Santa in the box, and the neighborhood made sure those letters were answered.

Mother Teresa once said, "In this life we cannot always do great things. But we can do small things with great love."

And Matthew 5:16 says, "...let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven."

What small thing can we do that will make a big difference?

January 15 Retreat to Create FUMC's Vision



Members of the Church Council, Sunday School leaders, FUMC staff, and several of their spouses participated in a 3-hour planning retreat on January 15th. To open the retreat, Pastor Mike shared a Demographics Snapshot from a 5-mile radius around the church. It showed tremendous opportunity for church growth and to expand our ministry. Retreat participants were then asked to project their mindset from 2022 to 2024 and to forecast goals that the church should pursue from the present day through 2024 to improve church membership, attendance, and spiritual growth. To conclude the discussion, the group prioritized the improvement goals. The highest priority are proposed as the Church's Vision for the future. (See the categories and their goals below.)
