"Come expectantly seeking Jesus. Follow Him boldly. Go witness intentionally."



Many years ago, a man named Leslie Weatherhead wrote a book called <u>The Significance of Silence</u>. It is a collection of his sermons. One of the chapters near the end of the book is called, "Resting in God's Infinity" and it was Weatherhead's attempt at expressing how great God really is. At the beginning of his talk he writes, "all of the great biblical writers set the thought of God's greatness over against the need of man." (p. 185).

He goes on to quote Psalm 34:3: "Oh magnify the Lord with me...". This, he says, is not to make us grovel around, crawl at God's feet, and tell God how wonderful a person He is. No, instead we should see this phrase as our realization of how truly BIG God is. He is more than adequate for our needs, our worried minds, and rest-

less hearts. He is truly big enough for our worries, our loved ones, and our world. Weatherhead exclaims that we should have a "great God...not...an elderly gentleman in a black frock coat, who is almost wholly absorbed in our little denominational chapel." His main argument in this message seems to be that more likely than not, that we have made God way too small. And when we make God too small there are three things that can happen.

First, God will then be too small for our lives. You may even find yourself saying, "I'm afraid you can't do anything to help me." And this, of course, vastly underestimates God. The second thing that can happen if we make God too small is that we might believe He is too small for our prayers. And by this he means that we may fall prey to the misunderstanding that God can't possibly always hear all prayers from all people and keep them straight. His cool little analogy for this example is likened to us making God like, "...the old woman in the shoe who had so many children she didn't know what to do!" You see, God is infinite. It is not harder for God to guide two people than it is for one. And finally, if we make God too small, we might end up saying, "God is too small for our problems."

We might look at evil in the world and say God is not there. We might look at injustice and say that God is not there. We might look at unfair things and say that God is not there either. Each is a mistake. With much more detail Mr. Weatherhead explains his view, but he ends up giving us three things we should always hold onto...no mater what. There are three certainties. One, the values of God are truth, goodness, justice, beauty, and kindness. People who know God best exemplify these qualities. Two, our blessedness is God's goal. In spite of any evidence to the contrary, God wants our wellbeing. Three, when we look at Jesus, we look at God. Jesus was loving, patient, kind, and caring. Jesus was forgiving, healing, lifegiving and so much more.

This is who God is. So, to quote a poem called <u>The Marshes of Glenn</u> that Weatherhead quotes in his book, "Behold, I will build me a nest on the greatness of God..." We cannot comprehend the infinity of God, nor can we comprehend the infinity of God's goodness, but we sure can rest in it. Where are you building your nest?

Methodists have been debating their denomination's stance on issues related to an official stance on the "Gay Lifestyle." Methodism has historically been based on what the greater Church calls The Book of Discipline. In other words— "The Bible" re: issues confronting the Church and it's role in establishing an understanding of what Methodism is and isn't for its' members and prospective members.

The Methodist Book of Discipline has been subject to change historically. And, it has been edited through a rigorous democratic process over the years. Importantly, one of those editorial changes occurred in 1972, when the following language was added: "The practice of homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching."

Over the decades since that editorial change to our Book of Discipline in 1972, Delegates to every quadrennial meeting of the Methodist Church have debated that change with proposals ranging from: drop the language as it exists or make editorial changes which would redefine what the language means. The most immediate impact the Church's full implementation on the denomination's stance related to the official acceptance of an important consideration. That is: the ordaining and assignment to pastor status of an individual who was of homosexual persuasion.

Delegations to the 2019 special session approved something called the "Traditional Plan" which strengthened enforcement of language in The Discipline against the ordination and marriage of LGBTQ members.

Since then the issue has been identified as one that apparently is unsolvable through editing of the "Church's Bible" and a fundamental disagreement between individuals and congregations on both sides of the issue.

In the meantime since the adoption of the 1972 change decades ago, we who are members of United Methodist Church and especially those who have attended meetings and Annual Conferences locally and around the world have attempted to make peace and find a negotiated solution to this very fundamental disagreement to no avail.

Delegates to numerous World Conferences representing the worldwide church have obviously been dealing with the same issue with the same result—NO PROGRESS. So, for the past three General Conferences formal proposals have been considered to provide for splitting up of the United Methodist Church into what amounts to "Progressives" and "Conservatives." Obviously there has not been a formal vote taken on this proposed solution with the postponements of the last two World Conferences.

Sunday May 1, 2022 was the launch of a new theologically conservative denomination splintering from "The United Methodist Church." Leaders of the this newly established denomination to be based upon the existing Book of Discipline have named this new entity as the "Global Methodist Church."
