

The First United Methodist Church of Quitman is seeking a part-time (15 hours per week) Children's Ministry Coordinator to join the church staff. Working with children from infants through fifth grade, the

Free Summer Meals for Quitman-area School-age Children Are Available on Mondays from 5:00 pm-6:30 pm:

Beginning on July 25, the Quitman First United Methodist Church (FUMC) and the Quitman Rotary Club teamed to provide daytime meals for school-age children in the Quitman-area. The objective of this Summer-Meals Program is to help meet the nutritional needs of children in families whose budgets for daytime meals may be limited. Under the program, school-aged children are provided with three breakfast and three lunchtime meals each week at no

charge. Each meal is intended to be light but nourishing. Refrigeration of a portion of the meals is needed, but preparation is minimal.

The six meals will be distributed at the covered entry to FUMC's J.O.Y. Hall from 5:00pm to 6:30pm on Monday August 1 and Monday August 8. No paperwork or identification will be required. A family representative only needs to drive into the covered entry and advise volunteers of the number of children who will be served.

This year's Summer-Meals program will conclude in mid-August when the Quitman ISD classes and regular meal programs commence. FUMC and Rotary plan to resume their Summer -Meals Program in 2023, either before or at the conclusion of similar summertime meal programs at the Quitman Schools and Public Library.

YOUTH NEWS

Church family,

We have had an exciting summer that has involved youth outings, baseball games, church camp, and a mission trip. Despite the many hours of preparation, amazing participation across the church, and occasional periods of exhaustion I have to say that I am proud and excited by how our youth represented our church, supported each other, and encouraged those outside our group.

In late July we attended "Big House" as our 2022 mission trip. Big House is very similar to UM Army except that Big House allows both junior high and high school students to participate together. We were hosted by First United Methodist Church of Frankston which is south of Tyler. There were six different churches, including ours, in attendance. A total of 120 students arrived on Wednesday afternoon at FUMC Frankston. All were visibly excited about the week ahead. Our church took a total of 18 people, including 12 students and 6 adults.

Our group of 18 was split among different work groups at multiple job sites. One site involved repairing a kitchen sink and cabinet as well as a deck. A second group poured concrete at a sister church. Another group built a ramp, worked concrete, painted pipe fencing, and painted the inside of a church. Our students were also involved in cutting down trees and building decks and stairs.

Several of our students readily assumed leadership roles during our devotional and worship times. Some lead in the prayers, and one of our students lead the morning devotional. It has been amazing to watch students who struggled to lead worship activities seven months ago be so willing now to jump in and take leadership opportunities.

Liberty Lines By: John Sparks

The writings I have presented about the formation of the *Global Methodist Church* has been resourced from material provided on the movement's web site. I urge each of us from both congregations to visit that web site as we all develop our own understanding of this alternative to the United Methodist Church.

In particular I recommend a recently published article by Walter B. Fenton which appears on the website for its treatment of 14 *beliefs* that Fenton calls "Our Witness to the World."

Fenton explains that the founding council of the Global Methodist Church is still in the early stages of its formation saying..."the Church's 17-member Transitional Leadership Council and its very small staff will address political and social policy issues with restraint and modesty. The council members and staff readily acknowledge their tasks are transitional in nature guiding the new Church to a convening General Conference where duly elected representatives will begin to give more definitive shape to the denomination."

"Consequently, the council has acted with restraint when setting forth guidelines for the Global Methodist Church's social witness to the world. In paragraph 202 of the *Transitional Book of Doctrines and Disciplines*, the TLC has adopted 14 statements rooted in scripture and the teachings of the church universal, to inform and guide GM Church members as they engage lessons in the public square."

Fenton continues "While Council members bring a wealth of experience and knowledge to their work, they and the Global Methodist Church's staff are committed to modesty when asked to speak directly on the Church's behalf regarding specific political and social issues." They strongly encourage current GM Church members and those interested in joining the new Church to carefully read and prayerfully reflect on the 14 statements as presented in Fenton's article.
