The world, especially our youth culture, is drowning in gender confusion. What is a real man or real woman? This question has become difficult to answer and seems to be undefinable in our day. How do you teach that to a child or anyone searching for an answer? The direct and simple answer is that God defines real men and women, not the world.

The consistent message from the world that youth hear today is there is no real difference between men and women, except for some body parts. The desire to neutralize or even eliminate the gender distinctions and differences that God has hardwired into human beings (Gen. 1:26–27) is blatant and constant. The flip side of that coin is that the youth of today are being bombarded with false ideas of what a real man or real woman should be, if they choose to identify as such.

Worse yet, now a person can "identify" with a gender. Truth, hormones, and physiology do not matter as long as I decide what gender I am. What foolishness! Scripture shows God's creation of mankind and then lays out what a Godly man or Godly woman looks like.

In the world we live in, real men and real women are rare. Many of those men and woman who appear across the spectrum of entertainment, in the movies, on Netflix, Hulu, or Disney, and even those involved in the teaching of youth today have a skewed view of Godly men and women. Genesis 1:27 says, "So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him (mankind); male and female He created them."

The confusion of our culture is a work of Satan to distort God's creation. It's effective because the same lie of the enemy has been used over the centuries. The lies are sold through what appears as good. The lies ride on the back of truth and good values. It is like mixing poison with a healthy meal. Satan easily deceives us if we do not have a firm foundation, God's Word. Satan's strategy is simple, make sin look normal and make righteousness seem strange. Don't be fooled! Every one of us is being transformed either into the image of Jesus or into the image of the world.

Most of the world's messages ride on the back of tolerance, acceptance, and diversity. You are considered intolerant if you do not allow the world's defined standards into your circle of influence. Leadership in the church has become cracked with those that have different standards than God's Word. Addiction dependent individuals, open married couples, broken marriages, or anyone practicing lifestyles that are clearly stated as contrary to God's design. Please know this. Jesus didn't hang out with sinners as an act of tolerance and affirmation of their sins. He spent time with them, so they would believe in Him as the Savior who saves sinners and changes lives. Our involvement in the world ought to be about restoration with God not recorrecting to our opinions.

Culture cannot correctly define real men and women because it refuses to consider God's definitions. Changing the definitions of real men and women does not have immediate consequences and without the immediate consequences, the false definitions of real men and women stay with us. Even when exposed as wrong, the world explains the consequences away with other lies and confusion. Inadequate definitions provide fertile soil for chaos and confusion. And Satan wants the confusion because he opposes all that God is.

We, the Church, must stop operating with opinion and theory and accept the facts. God defines real men and women.\

We see this scenario day in and day out in our own kids, week in week out with the kids that come to church. There are plenty of people willing to disciple our kids for us. It can either be celebrities, ideologies, and even politics, or our kids can be discipled by the parents, the Gospel, and the Church. We must never subcontract our child's discipleship out to the world.

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but **be transformed by the renewing of your mind**. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.—Romans 12:1-2
