However, the joy in the face of our youth has been beautiful to see as they come to terms with the idea that they are really cared for here.

Second, May is very busy in the life of our church and youth ministry. We have multiple opportunities connect with each other and share in our fellowship.

May 10-12: Help your mother (or wife) clean out some space. Our Youth will be hosting a community garage sale and will be accepting unneeded items beginning in May.

May 19: Senior Sunday. We will be honoring those graduating from school this year with a focus on the three seniors from our church. If you want to see the youth break out of their shell and serve, connect, and be challenged I would like to encourage you to consider coming with us this year. 
The FUMC Scholarship Committee is pleased to an-
