### **Operation Christmas Child**

Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. Its mission is to provide local partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ. These simple gifts are shipped outside the United States to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease; and to children living on Native American reservations in the U.S.

Annually FUMC Quitman's church members are encouraged to pack one or more shoe boxes with small toys, personal care items, school supplies, clothes and craft or activity items. For the past several years Quitman FUMC has also served as a collection point for other area churches and organizations which participate in the Shoe Box program

Church members may also provide monetary support for OCC's "The Greatest Journey", a dynamic, 12-lesson Bible student course. After receiving a shoebox gift, children are encouraged to enroll in The Greatest Journey which guides them through what it means to faithfully follow Christ.

Offered through local churches around the world, this course, developed by Samaritan's Purse and the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association, teaches boys and girls how to know Christ, grow in their faith, and share this Good News with others. Local teachers engage children's classes with colorful Bible stories and Scripture memorization. As a result, families are reached, churches grow, new churches are started, and communities are transformed

#### East Texas Food Bank Mobile Pantry

The East Texas Food Bank (ETFB) Mobile Pantry puts ETFB on the front lines in fighting hunger by delivering fresh produce to communities with a high percentage of people in need of assistance. For Wood County, Quitman FUMC, the Rotary and Pilot Clubs, and others provide volunteers who help spread the word about the program and assist in the actual distribution. The Wood County Distribution takes place on the third Wednesday of every month at Quitman's Bud Moody Stadium. There is no documentation or eligibility test to receive the free produce. Hundreds of Wood County families have benefited from the monthly distribution.

### **QISD Back Pack Program**

The Church purchases food from the East Texas Food Bank and volunteers from FUMC and Rotary work with the Quitman Independent School District (QISD) to provide supplemental weekend meals for students whose parents may not be able to adequately supply it themselves. Volunteer teams of 2 normally pack the meals at FUMC on Thursday morning for delivery to QISD later that day. The meals are distributed as needed by QISD on Friday.

## Wood County Child Protection Board

The Board provides children that are placed in foster care with an initial clothing allowance, a monthly allowance, back-to-school money to help with clothes and school supplies, Christmas gifts and money to help with summer activities. They also operate the Wood County Rainbow, that serves as a no-cost outlet for clothing, hygiene items, and other supplies for children just coming under Child Protective Services supervision.

The Board is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization, so all donations are tax deductible within the limits imposed by federal law.
